Information We Collect Through Our Website

We may collect the following information when you interact with our website:

Information Sharing with Affiliates, Partners, and for Legal or Business Reasons

While **NeuroHear** prioritizes the confidentiality of your medical and personal information, there are specific and limited instances in which we may share data with outside parties – always with your privacy and applicable legal requirements in mind.

1. Affiliates and Business Partners

We may share non-medical, non-identifiable information with trusted affiliates, vendors, and business partners who help us operate our practice, deliver services, host our website, or market our services. These parties are bound by agreements that require them to maintain confidentiality and follow applicable privacy and security standards.

This may include:

- Marketing consultants
- Web hosting providers
- IT and analytics services
- HIPAA-compliant CRM platforms

We do **not** share protected health information (PHI) with business partners unless required for treatment, payment, or healthcare operations and only in accordance with HIPAA and applicable business associate agreements.

2. Legally Required Disclosures

We may disclose information if required to do so by law, such as:

- In response to a court order, subpoena, or legal process
- To comply with federal or state health and safety regulations
- To cooperate with law enforcement or government investigations
- To respond to claims or protect our legal rights

When legally compelled, we only share the minimum necessary information required by law.

3. Use of Non-Identifiable, Aggregated Data

We may use or share aggregated or anonymized data that does **not identify any individual** to evaluate performance, research general trends, or improve our marketing strategies. This type of data does not include personal details and cannot be traced back to a specific person.

Example uses include:

- Website performance analysis
- Ad campaign reporting
- Patient satisfaction trend reports

4. Business Transfers, Sale, or Bankruptcy

If NeuroHear is ever involved in a merger, acquisition, sale of business assets, or bankruptcy proceeding, information collected through our website or practice, including personal and health information, may be transferred to another entity as part of that transaction.
